Yes, the library is currently closed for the renovation and modernization, and construction is currently underway. Our Director of Library Services, Paymaneh Maghsoudi, is working closely with our City Manager, Brian Saeki and the Construction Management firm for a projected time-line completion in Spring 2022 at a cost of approximately \$17,000,000.

The recent community-wide July matching fund fundraiser far exceeded our expectations. A huge 'Thank you' goes out to our Whittier library supporters including those donors who will be recognized on our Donor Wall.
